THE LION SLEEPS TONIGHT (KIDS SONG)



Welcome to School To Go and today's lesson!

This is a lesson in the subject of "English" about "The Jungle" in three episodes, with the three themes: "Five little monkeys", "Monkey see, monkey do" and finally "The lion sleeps tonight". There will be both listening texts and exercises in the episodes.

Introduction

We'll listen carefully to the words and enjoy the soothing melody that makes us feel like we're right there in the jungle with the lion. It's a calming and enjoyable way to learn new words while experiencing the magic of the jungle through music. Get ready to relax, learn, and imagine a beautiful jungle scene!

Learning objectives for the lesson

By the end of our lesson, you will be able to:

1. Understand and repeat 10 new English words from the song “The Lion Sleeps Tonight.”
2. Describe the peaceful actions of the lion using simple English sentences (e.g., “The lion is sleeping”).

Before We Start, Let’s Hear a Cozy Story

To get us in the mood, let’s hear a cozy story about a lion and the jungle. This story will help you understand more about the peaceful nature of lions and the world they live in.

The Gentle King of the Jungle

Let's Listen Together

Now Let's Learn Some New Words

Before we hear the song with music, here are 10 new words to help you understand the song better. Listen closely and repeat after me:

1. Lion
2. Sleep
3. Jungle
4. Quiet
5. Mighty
6. Night
7. Moon
8. Dream
9. Peaceful
10. Rest

Great job! Now you're ready for the song.

Just Listen and Enjoy the Song and Music

Let's listen to "The Lion Sleeps Tonight." As you listen, focus on the words and the peaceful feeling the song brings. Picture the lion resting in the quiet jungle, and imagine the gentle sounds of the night. Just relax, listen carefully, and enjoy this beautiful song about the jungle.

After the Song

Now that we've listened to the song, let's review the 10 new words we learned. Think about what they mean in your language and how we used them in the song:

1. Lion – a big, strong animal
2. Sleep – to rest with eyes closed
3. Jungle – a forest with lots of plants and animals
4. Quiet – without noise
5. Mighty – very strong or powerful
6. Night – the time when it is dark
7. Moon – the round object that shines in the sky at night
8. Dream – pictures or stories you see in your mind when you sleep
9. Peaceful – very calm and quiet
10. Rest – to relax and stop being active

Here the lesson ends.

Now it's time to complete a few tasks and reflect on what we've just learned.

Work tasks

1. Drawing Task: Draw a picture of the sleeping lion in the jungle. What does the jungle look like at night? Label your drawing with English words like "lion," "moon," and "jungle."
2. Writing Task: Write a short sentence about the lion. You can say something like, "The lion sleeps in the quiet jungle."
3. Story Task: Imagine what the animals in the jungle do while the lion sleeps. Write or draw a short story about the quiet night in the jungle.

Once you have completed the tasks, this episode will end.

Here starts the ideas for teachers:

Ideas for the teacher

- Use Visual Aids: Show images of lions, the jungle, and nighttime scenes to help students visualize the setting of the song. This helps students connect the words with the images.
- Quiet Reflection: After listening to the song, have a quiet reflection time where students can close their eyes and imagine the jungle at night. Ask them to describe what they see and feel in their minds.

- Vocabulary Matching Game: Play a game where students match pictures of jungle animals and nighttime objects (like the moon) with the new words they've learned.
- Discussion and Reflection: Ask students how the song made them feel. Was it peaceful? Did they imagine the jungle in their minds? Encourage them to use simple English words to describe their thoughts.
- Calming Atmosphere: Create a calm and relaxing atmosphere in the classroom while listening to the song, using dimmed lights or soft music. This will help students focus on the peaceful message of the song.
- Drawing Activity: Ask students to draw their version of the sleeping lion in the jungle. Let them use the new vocabulary to describe their drawings.
